DORA – Mapping and classification of ICT services for financial entities

Does the service qualify as an ICT service?

ICT services are defined as:

- digital and data services provided through ICT systems;
- to one or more internal or external users on an ongoing basis;
- including hardware as a service and hardware services, which includes the provision of technical support via software or firmware updates by the hardware provider;
- excluding traditional analogue telephone services.

Third party risk requirements not applicable to the service

Outsourcing rules may still apply if the service qualifies as outsourcing.

Requirements relating to third party risks

- ensuring an effective and prudent management of ICT risks.
- drafting and implementing documentation, including:
 - adaptation and regular review of a strategy on ICT third-party risk;
 - contractual arrangement with ICT services providers (including intragroup); and
 - maintaining and updating a register of information.
- required cooperation of the ICT third-party service provider in the event ICT incidents occur relating to the ICT service.
- annual reporting requirement to the regulator.

Does the ICT service support a critical or important function?

Critical or important function means a function:

- the disruption of which would materially impair the financial performance of a financial entity, or the soundness or continuity of its services and activities;
- or the discontinued, defective or failed performance of that function would materially impair the continuing compliance of a financial entity with the conditions and obligations of its authorisation, or with its other obligations under applicable financial services law.

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Additional requirements relating to ICT service supporting critical or important functions

- additional contractual provisions to include in the contractual arrangement with the ICT third-party service provider (e.g. on subcontracting and audit).
- additional information required to be included in the register.
- notification to the regulator of any planned contractual arrangement on the use of ICT services supporting critical or important functions as well as when a function has become critical or important.
