1 INTRODUCTION AND PURPOSE

This statement is made on behalf of NautaDutilh N.V. and its subsidiaries (including NautaDutilh UK B.V. and NautaDutilh Londen B.V.), pursuant to the Modern Slavery Act 2015 for the financial year ending on 31 December 2025. References in this statement to "we", "us", "our", or "the firm" are references to NautaDutilh N.V. and its subsidiaries.

NautaDutilh is committed to taking appropriate measures to ensure that there is no presence of modern slavery and human trafficking within any part of our organisation and our supply chains. We acknowledge that these acts violate human rights and are contrary to our values and principles.

2 ORGANISATION

NautaDutilh is an international law firm practicing Dutch, Belgian and Luxembourg law. We have offices in Amsterdam, Rotterdam, London, New York, Brussels, and Luxembourg. NautaDutilh recognises its responsibility to uphold the rule of law and act in line with our professional standards. Our Business Integrity Standards summarise our core professional values and principles, they provide guidance to conduct our day-to-day business. As a professional services provider, we assess the overall risk of modern slavery within our operations to be relatively low. We acknowledge that possible risks of modern slavery and human trafficking lies primarily within our supply chain.

3 SUPPLIERS

Our supply chain has five broad categories: business services, real estate, professional service, technology, and travel. We are dedicated to recognising and mitigating the risks of modern slavery across our supply chain. If at any stage we identify an increased risk of slavery or human trafficking within our business or supply chains, we will conduct a thorough investigation of such risk and promptly mitigate any risk or impact. This would include reviewing our due diligence process and engaging with the supplier.
